	<p>14 February 2023</p> <p>Late Night 2019 Emma Thompson plays Katherine Newbury, a legendary late-night talk show host, whose world is turned upside down when she hires her only female staff writer.</p>
	<p>14 March 2023</p> <p>Vice 2019 This explores the epic story of a bureaucratic Washington insider who quietly became the most powerful man in the world as Vice-President to George W Bush, reshaping the country and the globe, with Christian Bale, Amy Adams, Steve Carell & Sam Rockwell.</p>
	<p>11 April 2023</p> <p>Aftermath 2019 This film is set in post war Germany in 1946, when Rachael Morgan (Keira Knightley) arrives in the ruins of Hamburg in the bitter winter, to be reunited with her husband Lewis (Jason Clark) a British colonel charged with rebuilding the shattered city.</p>
	<p>19 September 2023</p> <p>Dark Waters 2020 The film follows the shocking story of a tenacious attorney (Mark Ruffalo) who uncovers a dark secret that connects a growing number of unexplained deaths, due to one of the world's largest corporations.</p>

	<p>10 October 2023</p> <p>Red Joan 2019</p> <p>The year is 2000 and Joan Stanley (Judi Dench) is living in contented retirement in suburbia. Her tranquil life is suddenly disrupted when she is arrested by MI5 and accused of providing intelligence to Communist Russia.</p>
	<p>14 November 2023</p> <p>Radioactive 2020</p> <p>From the 1870s to the modern era, this film is a journey through Marie Curie's (Rosamund Pike) enduring legacies – her passionate relationships, scientific breakthroughs, and the consequences that followed for her and the world.</p>
